### **The Epistle: 2 Corinthians 12:2-10**

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven-- whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person-- whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows-- was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

### **The Gospel: Mark 6:1-6**

Jesus left that place and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Then Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house." And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief. Then he went about among the villages teaching.

## *REJECTING THE MESSENGER!*

“Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house” (Mark 6:4).

To His hometown folks pictured in the Gospel for today, Jesus must have looked quite ordinary. They had watched Him grow up, they knew His family. They had known Him when He was a little kid. They had watched Him wrestle with the idea of His own mission, grow restless in His father’s carpenter shop, and finally pick up and leave to “be about His Father’s business”.

The problem with familiarity is that we do not see people for who they really are, but only in the context of their growing up. We place labels on people, depending on their family background (their antecedents). That is a very human thing. So when Jesus came back to Nazareth for a brief visit, the people could not understand His stirring sermons, parables and miracles. They could not see anything Messianic about Him. Certainly He was no more than Mary and Joseph’s son with whom they had grown up or watch Him grow up before their very eyes!

The story of Jesus calming the storm, casting our demons, healing the woman and raising a little girl to life, together with His many sermons about the Kingdom of God and parables about the Kingdom were too much for His hometown folks to accept. Among them there was amazement, doubt, awe, and fear, and then there was ridicule and lack of faith in what He was doing. In addition to all of this, Jesus also spoke of the promise of a new creation, a new kingdom and power from on high. Yet He presented Himself as the ordinary kid who had left Nazareth some time back. The response He received from His hometown was understandable. They found Him to be too much for them. In fact they said, “Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to Him? What deeds of power has He done by His hands? Is not this the carpenter’s son, the son of Mary, ...and are not his brothers and sisters here with us?”

Jesus’ rejection at His hometown took its toll on Him. We can only imagine the pain of rejection that caused Him to say, “Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometowns”. It is hurtful to be rejected by anyone, but it is particularly hurtful to be rejected by one’s own people. Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith. He greatly desired to help them but found Himself unable to do so. You can’t help people against their will. He was saddened but not angry, for He realized how rejection can easily lead to anger.

We have all experienced rejection of one kind or another. But when that happens we have to be like Jesus, and not become embittered. He did what little He could

for them: He cured a few sick people then He decided to take His many gifts elsewhere. It is sometimes in situations like this that we experience the power of God. In our darkness we experience light and in our sins we experience His mercy and forgiveness. God's acceptance is far more important than that of our fellowman. So when we are rejected, we renew our faith in the God who never rejects us but is always willing to accept us.

Have you ever been rejected? I am sure you have, and so you know the feeling. When rejection comes again, as it surely will, trust God for His acceptance. And remember, His acceptance is more than any we can receive from human beings.

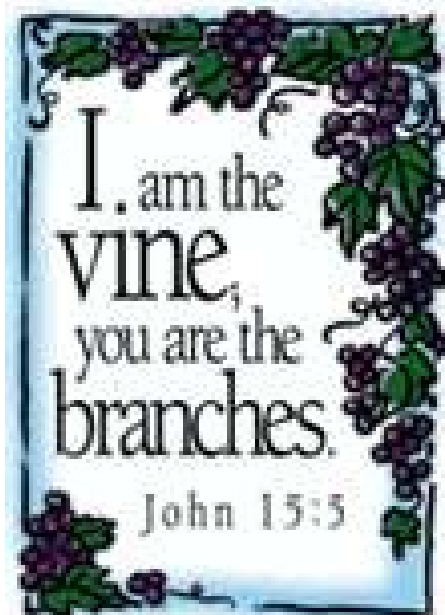
