**The First Lesson: Job 38:1-11, 16-18**

Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind: "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements-- surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy? "Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb? -- when I made the clouds its garment, and thick darkness its swaddling band, and prescribed bounds for it, and set bars and doors, and said, `Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stopped'? "Have you entered into the springs of the sea, or walked in the recesses of the deep? Have the gates of death been revealed to you, or have you seen the gates of deep darkness? Have you comprehended the expanse of the earth? Declare, if you know all this."

### **The Epistle: 2 Corinthians 5:14-21**

The love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

### **The Gospel: Mark 4:35-41; (5:1-20)**

When evening had come, Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" [They came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gerasenes. And when he had stepped out of the boat, immediately a man out of the tombs with an unclean spirit met him. He lived among the tombs; and no one could restrain him any more, even with a chain; for he had often been restrained with

shackles and chains, but the chains he wrenched apart, and the shackles he broke in pieces; and no one had the strength to subdue him. Night and day among the tombs and on the mountains he was always howling and bruising himself with stones. When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and bowed down before him; and he shouted at the top of his voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure you by God, do not torment me." For he had said to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" Then Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" He replied, "My name is Legion; for we are many." He begged him earnestly not to send them out of the country. Now there on the hillside a great herd of swine was feeding; and the unclean spirits begged him, "Send us into the swine; let us enter them." So he gave them permission. And the unclean spirits came out and entered the swine; and the herd, numbering about two thousand, rushed down the steep bank into the sea, and were drowned in the sea. The swineherds ran off and told it in the city and in the country. Then people came to see what it was that had happened. They came to Jesus and saw the demoniac sitting there, clothed and in his right mind, the very man who had had the legion; and they were afraid. Those who had seen what had happened to the demoniac and to the swine reported it. Then they began to beg Jesus to leave their neighborhood. As he was getting into the boat, the man who had been possessed by demons begged him that he might be with him. But Jesus refused, and said to him, "Go home to your friends, and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and what mercy he has shown you." And he went away and began to proclaim in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him; and everyone was amazed.]

## FATHERS WHO CARE (2009)

“Children’s children are the crowns of old men, and the glory of children is their father” (Prov. 17.6).

“Children don’t care how much fathers know until they know how much they care” (Author unknown). This little quotation is full of meaning as we celebrate Father’s Day. It marks the place where the rubber meets the road, so to say. Our children are looking for such qualities in their fathers today. But what do they find?

When we speak of God as Father we are really talking about Fatherhood, which is the standard for fatherhood today. This brings into focus the difference between “fatherhood” and “paternity”. Paternity refers to the responsibility which we as fathers assume for the physical needs of our children. After the child is born the father assumes responsibility for the nurture and care of the child, just as does the mother. Fatherhood, on the other hand, describes an intimate relationship, one of love, care, and concern. Most importantly, this is a reference to love, for fatherhood is more about love than about discipline and being a good provider; it is all about love and care. It is love that makes a father feel his responsibility. It is love that inspires a father to do what he does.

While some of our fathers are not worthy of the title “father”, most of our men are good fathers who love and care for their children. We have some good examples right here in St. Matthew’s, some of whom are being honored today. They are the ones whose children know that they care and love them very dearly. They may not be perfect, but they are faithful to their responsibilities. Many of our fathers are just as faithful and trustworthy as our mothers, but society has given them a bad rap and tends to portray fathers as men who do not really care or show concern. We have to reverse that trend by being just as loving and dependable as mothers. One way to do that is to have all of our children in our homes and in our marriages and to be there for our wives and children. We have to set the proper example for our sons if we are to have a positive effect of changing that attitude. When asked how a person could be changed, Albert Schweitzer said, “In three ways: by example, by example, and by example”. Can you be a model for future generations?

Fathers can be just as loving and caring as mothers. Many people don’t believe that, and, unfortunately, many of our children don’t believe that. All of us as men need to show them otherwise. We are not just the disciplinarians, but we must be the ones they can depend on when they need advice, love and care. We have to show them our love and care early in their lives and always. We have to be the ones to take them to school, to plays and music, and be there in the audience when they graduate or achieve some good result. Nothing makes children happy as when they see their fathers in the audience when they recite their lines in a play in preschool or high school. Nothing makes a child happier than to know that dad will be there for them, no matter what.

So as we honor all fathers today let us resolve to be loving and caring toward our children all their lives. When we do that, they will rise up and call us blessed too.

Having God as our Father and role model for fathers today means that we have a noble heritage, a meaningful present, and an even more glorious future. We all may not know our historical fathers, and some of us may not even know our biological fathers, but we do know our Heavenly Father whose name is God. We have a heritage that goes further back than slavery, further back than today's cultural biases, further back than Africa, further back than history itself. We have a heritage that no one can destroy. We are all God's children and He is our Father. At the bottom of it all is love: love of God and for all His children, and love of fathers for their children. That is the model that we who are fathers today want to pass on to the next generation, and with God's help, we will!

Happy Father's Day to all fathers of our church and our nation.

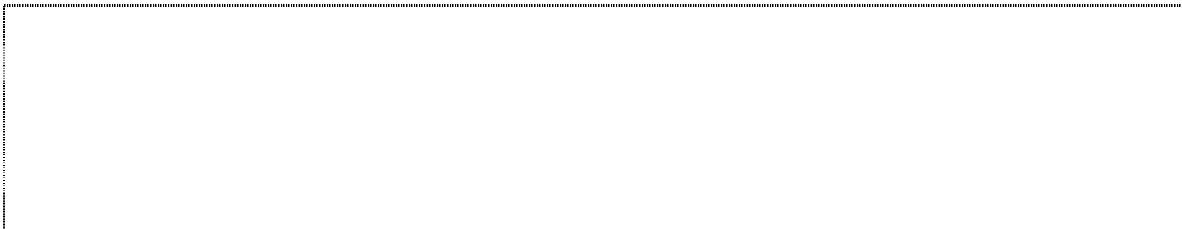
