**COLLECT FOR ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST**

Almighty God, by whose providence your servant John the Baptist was wonderfully born, and sent to prepare the way of your Son our Savior by preaching repentance: Make us so to follow his teaching and holy life, that we may truly repent according to his preaching; and, following his example, constantly speak the truth, boldly rebuke vice, and patiently suffer for the truth's sake; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

**The First Lesson: Isaiah 40:1-11**

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

**ALL:** Thanks be to God

**The Epistle: Acts 13:14b-26**

On the sabbath day Paul and his companions went into the synagogue and sat down. After the reading of the law and the prophets, the officials of the synagogue sent them a message, saying, "Brothers, if you have any word of exhortation for the people, give it." So Paul stood up and with a gesture began to speak: "You Israelites, and others who fear God, listen. The God of this people Israel chose our ancestors and made the people great during their stay in the land of Egypt, and with uplifted arm he led them out of it. For about forty years he put up with them in the wilderness. After he had destroyed seven nations in the land of Canaan, he gave them their land as an inheritance for about four hundred fifty years. After that he gave them judges until the time of the prophet Samuel. Then they asked for a king; and God gave them Saul son of Kish, a man of the tribe of Benjamin, who reigned for forty years. When he had removed him, he made David their king. In his testimony about him he said, 'I have found David, son of Jesse, to be a man after my heart, who will carry out all my wishes.' Of this man's posterity God has brought to Israel a Savior, Jesus, as he promised; before his coming John had already proclaimed a baptism of repentance to all the people of Israel. And as John was finishing his work, he said, 'What do you suppose that I am? I am not he. No, but one is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of the sandals on his feet.' "My brothers, you descendants of Abraham's family, and others who fear God, to us the message of this salvation has been sent."

**ALL:** Thanks be to God

**The Gospel: Luke 1:57-80**

The time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father. But his mother said, "No; he is to be called John." They said to her, "None of your relatives has this name." Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. He asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And all of them were amazed. Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. Fear came over all their neighbors, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. All who heard them pondered them and said, "What then will this child become?" For, indeed, the hand of the Lord was with him. Then his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke this prophecy: "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them. He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his servant David, as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old, that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us. Thus he has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors, and has remembered his holy covenant, the oath that he swore to our ancestor Abraham, to grant us that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before him all our days. And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, to give knowledge of salvation to his people by the forgiveness of their sins. By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace." The child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day he appeared publicly to Israel.

**LEADER:** This is the Gospel of Christ

## **THE NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST**

In many cultures the act of naming a child is viewed as giving the child his/her identity. In Jewish society circumcision was the boy's initiation into the community of the People of God (Gen. 17:9-14). There does not seem to be any general rule to determine who names the child. Sometimes it is the father (Gen. 21:3), and at other times it is the community. In the case of the naming of John the Baptist, the angel gave the name. Since the name given is somehow linked with the person's identity, the name reflects what is expected of the child.

The neighbors and relatives presumed that the child would take the father's name, which was common then as now. They saw his identity linked to his family, but the boy's parents insisted that his name is John, a name which means "God is gracious". The name could refer to God's goodness in giving John to his parents who were advanced in age (Luke 1:7), or it could be a promise of future blessings. Since the name came from heaven it is correct to say that the child's destiny would be a heavenly one. He was truly a chosen child. When Zachariah was given back his speech he confirmed the child's name. John had indeed been set apart for a special mission: To prepare the way for Jesus.

John the Baptist is the link between the old and the new dispensations. He is the last of the Old Testament prophets. He is both a prophet and the forerunner of the Messiah. Unlike the other Synoptic Gospels, which introduce John the Baptist in Scripture as an adult, the Gospel of Luke provides an account of his infancy. He was the cousin of Jesus, born six months before Him. He was a direct descendent of Aaron, which places him in the priestly line. Jesus described him as the "last and greatest of the prophets".

John preached a Gospel of repentance and called upon the people to prepare for the coming of the Messiah (Is. 40). He baptized his followers to signify their repentance and new life. He baptized Jesus in the River Jordan at the beginning of His public ministry. According to the Gospel of John, Jesus superceded John. It was John who declared, "He must increase and I must decrease", and he declared Jesus the Lamb of God.

John's sharp words of rebuke of the Tetrarch Herod for marrying his brother Philip's wife led to his imprisonment. It was from prison that he sent a message to Jesus which seemed to reveal some doubt in John's mind about the Messiah, despite his earlier witness to Jesus as the Messiah. John was eventually beheaded on Herod's instructions after his reckless promise in a drunken stupor. With that promise to Salome, Herodius was able to achieve her objective of eliminating John.

The Feast of St. John the Baptist is a good time for us to accept a call to repentance and a new life in Christ. It is appropriately our Diocesan Feast of Title. So we who have been baptized into Christ must live out our baptismal promises in our daily lives. We would do

well to listen to the admonition of John the Baptist and prepare for the day when we will meet our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ when He comes again.
