COLLECT:

O God, the King of glory, you have exalted your only Son Jesus Christ with great triumph to your kingdom in heaven: Do not leave us comfortless, but send us your Holy Spirit to strengthen us, and exalt us to that place where our Savior Christ has gone before; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, in glory everlasting. Amen.

The First Lesson: Acts 1:15-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus-- for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." (Now this man acquired a field with the reward of his wickedness; and falling headlong, he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. This became known to all the residents of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their language Hakeldama, that is, Field of Blood.) "For it is written in the book of Psalms, 'Let his homestead become desolate, and let there be no one to live in it'; and 'Let another take his position of overseer.' So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us-- one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

Psalm 68:1-20

Exsurgat Deus

- 1 Let God arise, and let his enemies be scattered; * let those who hate him flee before him.
- 2 Let them vanish like smoke when the wind drives it away; * as the wax melts at the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God.
- 3 But let the righteous be glad and rejoice before God; * let them also be merry and joyful.
- 4 Sing to God, sing praises to his Name; exalt him who rides upon the heavens; * YAHWEH is his Name, rejoice before him!
- 5 Father of orphans, defender of widows, * God in his holy habitation!

- 6 God gives the solitary a home and brings forth prisoners into freedom; * but the rebels shall live in dry places.
- 7 O God, when you went forth before your people, * when you marched through the wilderness,

- 12 "Kings with their armies are fleeing away; * the women at home are dividing the spoils."
- 13 Though you lingered among the sheepfolds, * you shall be like a dove whose wings are covered with silver, whose feathers are like green gold.
- 14 When the Almighty scattered kings, * it was like snow falling in Zalmon.
- 15 O mighty mountain, O hill of Bashan! * O rugged mountain, O hill of Bashan!
- 16 Why do you look with envy, O rugged mountain, at the hill which God chose for his resting place? * truly, the LORD will dwell there for ever.
- 17 The chariots of God are twenty thousand, even thousands of thousands; * the Lord comes in holiness from Sinai.
- 18 You have gone up on high and led captivity captive; you have received gifts even from your enemies, * that the LORD God might dwell among them.
- 19 Blessed be the Lord day by day, * the God of our salvation, who bears our burdens.
- 20 He is our God, the God of our salvation; * God is the LORD, by whom we escape death.

The Epistle: 1 John 5:9-15

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life. And this is the boldness we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have obtained the requests made of him.

READER: The Word of the Lord

ALL: Thanks be to God

The Gospel: John 11b:9-19

Jesus prayed for his disciples, saying, "Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."

LEADER: This is the Gospel of Christ

ALL: Praise to Christ our Lord



JESUS PRAYS FOR HIS DISCIPLES

“As you have sent me into the world, so I sent them into the world” (John 17.18).

Thursday past was the Ascension of Our Lord. Just prior to His return to the Father, Jesus offered a prayer for His disciples as He sent them out to continue the work He begun during His earthly ministry. In that prayer Jesus gives us the imperative of praying before embarking on a new ministry. Just as Jesus was sent into the world by the Father, so the disciples were sent into the world by Jesus. Jesus came with the Father’s blessing, and now He offered the same blessing to His disciples. It was not an elaborate prayer full of mystery. It was simple and straightforward. What kinds of things did He pray for?

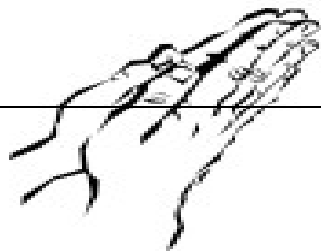
Firstly, He prayed that they would be faithful. Their task was not to be successful; only to be faithful. The temptation exists to concentrate on the success of ministry rather than the faithfulness of service. Secondly, Jesus prayed for unity among them. Jesus knew that it was so easy for His followers to exhibit disunity and so He prayed that they would not fall into that trap. Thirdly, He prayed that they might be preserved in the truth. It was so easy for the disciples to misrepresent Jesus in the world, but the truth is the truth, and the truth which they were to reveal was the one Jesus revealed to them of the Father. Fourthly, He prayed that they would be victorious over evil. Jesus knew that it was easy for the evil one to possess them and derail their ministry, and that temptation was always present. The very evil that they were to challenge in turning the world from the darkness of sin to the glorious light of forgiveness was what they were to guard against themselves.

So Jesus prayed for what was most important for them: faithfulness, unity, truth and victory over evil. He saw that life would be difficult for the disciples and so He covered them with His prayers. But notice that He did not pray that they be spared the temptations, trials and sufferings of their life of service, but rather that they might be faithful despite what they may face. He did not offer them an escape from the problems of life, but the strength to cope with them. His life and ministry was to inform theirs.

We who are called by God, (and each one of us is so called), are covered by the same prayer. We too are to be disciples of Jesus in our modern world, and we too have to guard against the evils of this life. Love must be the hallmark of our service, just as it was the hallmark of Jesus’ service. The Christian life is not a pursuit of virtues leading to perfection, but a process which begins with love and grows to perfection from this small beginning. Mother Teresa said, “The biggest disease in the world today is lack of love”. Love is everything. It demands the best of us and brings out the best in us.

May you always show love in your service to God and to humankind.
