### **The First Lesson: Acts 2:1-11**

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

### **The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 12:4-13**

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-- Jews or Greeks, slaves or free-- and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

### **The Gospel: John 20:19-23**

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

**PENTECOST, THE BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH**

“Receive the Holy Spirit.” (John 20:22).

We are all familiar with the events of Pentecost. We all know that there was a rushing mighty wind that swept through the whole place where the apostles were gathered. We all know of the speaking in tongues of those present with an amazing understanding by all present. But what we know less about Pentecost is that it is the birthday of the church. On that day the apostles received the gift of the Holy Spirit. But this does not mean that they were like children receiving birthday gifts. The Holy Spirit did not give the apostles anything. The Holy Spirit did not bring them anything, or give them anything they did not already have. What the Holy Spirit did was awaken in them the gifts that God had already given to them, and what happened that day was a sharing of those gifts for the benefit of the new Christian Church and all humankind.

Gifts are not always given just for our own use. Some gifts are meant to be shared. If we do not share the gifts given to us by God we limit ourselves and our ministries. We all have potential, but that potential must be released to be shared with others. The action of the Holy Spirit is mysterious, but not magical. What is required on our part as members of the Church is openness, willingness, and effort. Fear, selfishness, laziness, and apathy all lead to stagnation. What the Holy Spirit did for the apostles was to give them courage and boldness so that they were able to overcome the fear and timidity they were experiencing. From being a small group of confused people, huddled together in fear of the world, they became a fearless people with a mission and a message for the world. They were empowered to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. After the coming of the Holy Spirit they became bold and living witnesses for Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit has been given to us too, and just like the apostles on the Day of Pentecost, we too are called to be bold in the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The same gifts have been given to us and the message is the same. All we need to do is to follow the example of the apostles and declare with boldness the message given to us. In this gathering this morning in this church, we have all we need to experience what the apostles experienced that first Day of Pentecost. Here we have the simplicity of the Gospel, a group of “disciples” listening to the Word of God and receiving the broken bread and the poured out wine in memory of Jesus. And, of course, we have the Holy Spirit present with us now and at every Eucharist. It is the Holy Spirit who binds us together and helps us witness to Christ in the world. That is the true meaning of Pentecost.

Do not let yourselves be guided by the spirit of self-indulgence. Look at the legacy self-indulgence produces: bad temper, fighting, jealousy, cruelty, meanness, revenge, fornication, idolatry, and drunkenness. These are ugly things, and make life miserable. They are called the Works of the Flesh (Gal. 5:19-21). Rather, let yourself be guided by the Fruit of the Spirit. Look at the legacy the Spirit brings: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control. These are beautiful things, and make life joyful. They are a foretaste of the joy of heaven. They are the Fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22-23).

Which of these speak to your life on this Day of Pentecost? Let this be your prayer today:  
“Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on me!”

### **THE BIRTHDAY OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH**

The first Book of Common Prayer came into use on the Day of Pentecost, June 9, 1549, in the second year of the reign of King Edward the Sixth. From it have descended all sequent editions and revisions of the Book in the Churches of the Anglican Communion.

Though prepared by a commission of learned bishops and priests, the format, substance, and style of the Prayer Book were primarily the work of Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury, 1533 – 1556. The principal sources employed in its compilation were the medieval Latin service books of the Use of Sarum (Salisbury), with enrichments from the Greek liturgies, certain ancient Gallican rites, the vernacular German forms prepared by Luther, and a revised Latin liturgy of the reforming Archbishop Hermann of Cologne. The Psalter and other biblical passages were drawn from the English “Great Bible” authorized by King Henry the Eighth in 1539, and the Litany was taken from the English form issued as early as 1544.

The originality of the Prayer Book, apart from the felicitous translations and paraphrases of the old Latin forms, lay in its simplification of the complicated liturgical usages of the medieval Church, so that it was suitable for use by the laity as well as by the clergy. The Book thus became both a manual of common worship for Anglicans and a primary resources for their personal spirituality.
